CORE SERVICES

The core services now extends to providing Information, Advice and practical support on the variety of issues and that matters most to the clients such as social welfare, advocacy and forms filling. The service on employment and training still continues.

PRESTON EMPLOYMENT PARTNERSHIP (PEP):

One of the most successful partnership and meaningful relationship established to provide immense benefits to the clients in the areas of training and employment. The clients are now able to access job vacancies with support mechanism and expertise provided by PEP staff based at Preston Muslim Forum (PMF). From April 2007 to March 2008, 182 clients were registered with success rate of 72% securing employment and 28% were also enrolled for various skills based training courses.

PR1ME FOCUS

The project 'Access to Opportunities' was launched in January 2008 and involved securing funding for a 17 seater mini bus in partnership with Red Rose Sports Club and Canaries Football Club.

+VE MINDS

PMF has secured first round of funding to meet government's outcome on the prevention strand of violent extremism agenda. The project is designed in partnership with Shabash and local imaam.

PRESTON EAST CHILDRENCENTRE

The partnership established since June 2005 through SLA and involved secondment of PMF chief officer finished in March 2008. The strong foundation laid by PMF and PECC puts both organisations in a good stead to continue delivering children and families' agenda in partnership. PMF will continue to be a referral point for the families from Deepdale and assist them to facilitate their access to the services they are entitled to. PMF on behalf of PECC will run the Dads Group at Hamaara Centre every fortnight and manage play group assistant. We hope this relationship will continue for the benefit of families in the Deepdale area.

LUNCHEON CLUB

This much awaited services for the elderly people started in Feb 2008. This is initially a one year project funded by Preston Older People Partnership Board. Age Concern has also kindly contributed the resources. This is held at Preston Muslim Girls High School once a week and we hope that this becomes a long term feature in the area.

PQASSO

PMF successfully went through the quality standard process conducted by the city council. PMF is also participating in the capacity building workshops organised by City Council as part of their 'Building the Future' project.

AWARDS FOR ALL

Funding secured in February 2008 to deliver services for elderly people.

CONSULTATIONS

PMF was commissioned to carry out community consultations from the Probation Services and the University of Central Lancashire.

PMF YOUTH CLUB

The youth club made significant progress in terms of young people's participation, activities and volunteer contribution. The improved and spacious layout of the youth club now includes computers with broadband internet, and sports and other equipments including mini gym. Over the summer period the young people were taken on several planned trips such as ice skating, cinemas, ten pin bowling, football stadium, etc. The arts and craft workshops were held for young girls and separate girl's only sporting sessions. The project funded by Young People Fund finishes in March 2009.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT FOUNDATION

A one year multi-faith project was successfully delivered involving various outdoor and indoor activities involving young people from more than two faiths.

UK NATIONALITY SESSIONS

A bespoke software was produced to provide practice sessions to those applying for the British Citizenship at a nominal charge.

LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

One year funding secured from June 07 to cover PMF's core costs and services related to families and children.

WAY FORWARD 2008-2009

Build on the good practice from Preston Employment Partnership, and deliver enhanced employment initiatives.

Work closely with the County Council's commissioning process to deliver Children/Family and older people services.

Increase youth activities to include awareness of current issues related to Muslim youths.

Build capacity of local groups in the areas of family learning, youth activities and community development.

SURGERIES:

The surgeries for council tax, housing, immigration and Police are still continuing.

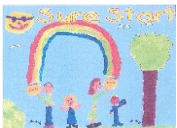
